



Kamloops Food Action Summer Student Job Posting

Kamloops Food Policy Council and Kamloops Regional Farmers' Market

Job Summary

This position encompasses two roles; approximately 20 hours a week assisting the Community Food Action Coordinator on the Gleaning Abundance Program, and 10 hours a week working with the managers of the Kamloops Regional Farmers' Market.

Application Information

This position is funded through the Canada Summer Jobs program. The candidate must meet the following criteria to be eligible:

- 1. Be between 15 and 30 years of age
- 2. Be registered as a full time student in the previous academic year and returning to school on a full-time basis in the next academic year.

Duties and Responsibilities

1. Gleaning Abundance Program Duties

- Oversee GAP harvest crews and coordinate distribution and delivery of produce
- Track and record accurate harvest data
- Assist Community Food Action Coordinator with administration of the gleaning program including recruitment of volunteers, scouting harvest sites, and assembling equipment
- Collect and record stories using photos and quotes from gleaners, growers, and recipients
- Help develop and organize GAP resource materials (safety information, volunteer orientation, etc)
- Contribute to the GAP web presence using the website and social media (Facebook, Twitter and Instagram)
- Represent GAP at other Community Food Action Program activities in Kamloops (e.g. Farmers' Market displays, Gardengate salsa challenge, etc)
- Assist with other related events and activities, as needed

2. Kamloops Regional Farmers' Market Duties

- Assist with special monthly events at the Wednesday and Saturday markets
- Research special topics of interest as outlined in the strategic plan (e.g. waste reduction, market layout)
- Review records of past board meetings to prepare for updating our constitution
- Contribute to the market web presence using social media (Facebook and Twitter)
- Assist the market manager and assistant manager in designing, conducting, and analyzing results of vendor and customer surveys

Skills & Qualifications

- Full-time student enrolled in a post-secondary program and returning to school in the fall
- Valid BC driver's license and clean driver's abstract
- Passionate about urban agriculture and local food systems
- Proficient with MS Office, Google Docs, and social media
- Excellent written communication skills
- Proven ability to supervise and engage with people of all ages
- Outgoing, friendly and approachable
- Ability to assess situations, identify problems, and initiate solutions
- Preference will be given to candidates with experience in data collection and analysis, survey design, and report writing

Working Conditions

This job requires flexible working hours (i.e. some evenings and weekends) and entails working outdoors in all kinds of weather.

Physical Requirements

The successful candidate must be able to lift 40 pounds and work on their feet for long periods of time.
